Cooking With Señor Rowe: Learn about the basics of food preparation, baking, cooking, nutrition and food safety. Learn about balancing sweet things we all like to eat and the foods that provide the most nutrition for us. You will learn how to make those healthy foods just a bit more delicious and the sweet things more irresistible. Minimum enrollment 5, maximum 8.

May 29 – June 2, mornings 9-noon, fee \$120. It's for students entering grades 6-12, Señor Rowe worked in food service as a baker before teaching. He is certified by the National Restaurant Association in food safety and enjoys combining what he has eaten while living abroad with the foods available in the supermarket and farmers' market.

Making Fantastic Masks Make amazing masks with plaster gauze and decorated with mixed media. Your imagination is the limit. These masks can be functional and actually worn, or purely decorative and hung on a wall: it's up to you! Taught by Seabury Art Instructor Laura Porter.

May 29 – June 2, mornings 9-noon, fee \$140. Open to incoming 5th-12th graders.

Metal Jewelry and Clay Creatures Express yourself in three dimensions! In this class, students will learn to work nickel silver, copper and brass metal into a wearable piece of jewelry. Basic filing, sawing, sanding and soldering skills will be introduced. The end results will be keepers!

Chess Camp does not require any prior chess knowledge, nor equipment. The process will be highly individualized with more play time scheduled for casual players but more intensive exercised or those wishing to improve their chess game as much as possible.

Two sessions: June 12-16 AND/OR July 24-28, mornings 9-noon, Fee \$120 taught by Steve Robinson, he has taught innumerable academic chess state individual champions as well as state and national academic championship teams.

Photography 101 Do you have a DSLR camera that you've always wanted to learn to use? Well this is the camp for you. Learn basic and advanced photography skills and principles and become an expert in manual photography. Topics include landscape, portrait, and macro photography. After field trips to local destinations, learn to edit photographs using Adobe Light room. Must have DSLR camera but I have up to two available for loan on first come first serve basis. It's Elementary, my dear Latin Get a jump start on learning Latin the Seabury way. We will focus on learning Latin vocabulary and Latin roots in our language. The class will introduce students to learning an inflected language and basic Latin endings. We will read and translate from the Cambridge Latin text. This course is a great introduction to learning the Latin language and word etymologies

6th Grade Math Enrichment Three months is a long time to go without math, especially given that each class builds on what was learned the previous year. From decimals to fractions, ratios to percent's, integers to probability, students will focus on understanding concepts more deeply, practicing key skills, and becoming better problem solvers. Though much of the instruction will be differentiated, the entire class will explore problem-solving strategies and study skills unique to math to help students tackle tricky word problems and study for tests. A positive, supportive environment paired with a wide variety of resources will ensure that students finish the week feeling more confident in their math ability and ready for classes in the fall. For middle school students entering 6th grade math. Maximum enrollment: 12 students

June 19-July 23, mornings 9am-noon, Fee \$120 taught by Seabury math teacher James LaRocca

Greek & Roman Mythology Calling all fans of mythology! Do you know everything there is to know about Greek & Roman myth? This course will test your knowledge! We will read, discuss, & create materials. Learn how the gods and the Earth were created. Lively discussion welcome!

June 26-30, mornings 9-noon, fee \$120. It's for students entering grades 6-12 and taught by Lawrence icon and actor extraordinaire, Ric Averill.

Algebra I Math Enrichment Three months is a long time to go without math, especially given that each class builds on what was learned the previous year. Whether you are a student who would like some extra help and review of fundamental Algebra concepts, or one who is looking for a challenge and a preview of what's to come, this class will suit your individual needs. Students will focus on understanding concepts more deeply, practicing key skills, and becoming better problem solvers. Though much of the instruction will be differentiated, the entire class will explore problem-solving strategies and study skills unique to math to help students tackle tricky word problems and study for tests. A positive, supportive environment paired with a wide variety of resources will ensure that students finish the week feeling more confident in their math ability and ready for classes in the fall. The concepts we will focus on are working with variables and combining like terms, working with algebraic properties (commutative, associative, distributive, etc.), and solving and graphing linear equations. Portuguese Language Camp! This camp will introduce students to communication skills in Portuguese. Students will enjoy learning basic grammatical structures, understanding of the language, writing comprehension, speaking and vocabulary while discovering the Brazilian way of life.

July 17-21, afternoons 1-4PM, fee \$120, it's for students entering grades 3 - 6. Taught by Brazilian citizen and Seabury teacher, Danielle Geronymo.

From song lyrics to Shakespearean Sonnets-classic marvels to contemporary masterpieces, we'll analyze key elements and contribute our own interpretations to this wonderful medium of expression. Classes will include reading, analysis, creative writing, games, and students will have a physical anthology of their poetry by the final class.

July 24 - 28, mornings 9-noon, fee \$120, it's for students entering grades 6th - 12th. Taught by Seabury English teacher Matt Patterson.

Study Skills and Brain Boosters! Not sure how to study? Do you feel like you're studying, but you don't seem to be getting anywhere? Then fire up your study skills this summer. With fun reading material, out-of-the-ordinary lessons, and hands-on practice, you'll learn some important stuff: How to set up your study space, figure out your learning style, take better notes, and get more out of what you read. We'll also learn a bit about how your brain works, and how to prepare your brain for learning well. This course is designed for students coming to Seabury for the first time, but it will be great for any student who wants to improve those study skills, no matter where the student goes to school. No homework. Maximum enrollment 15.

July 24-28, mornings 9:00-noon, Fee \$120 Open to students entering grades 7-9, taught by Sonja Czarnecki

Becoming a Sixth-Grade Seahawk Nervous about taking your first big test in middle school? Afraid you might get lost in the hallways between classes? This class will help the incoming 6th grade Seabury student get over those first day jitters in a snap! From touring the school to practicing organization, checking homework and grades online to developing important study skills, we will learn what it takes to be a successful Seahawk. By the end of the week, you'll be ready to keep that new locker clean, take great notes in class, and sit at Morning Meeting calm and confident on your first day. Of course, we will also have TONS of fun along the way getting to know each other and making new friends

July 24-28, mornings 10-noon, there is no fee for this class. It's for incoming Seabury 6th grade students only. Taught by Krista Barbour

The Multiple Choice Test Prep Training Course (four 3-hour sessions) provides a classroom setting with researched and proven test taking strategies related to each section of the ACT. Skills will be taught, practiced, and discussed, and students will be asked to spend time on their own internalizing the skills. Some portions of practice tests are given during sessions, allowing immediate discussion and review of how the strategies work. In the final session, each student is counseled on strategies about how to maximize strengths and minimize weaknesses in preparation for Test Day. **Students taking this course should sign up for the September ACT to put their newfound skills into practice**
