**READING ASSIGNMENT:**

*Pride and Prejudice*, Jane Austen  
*White Teeth*, Zadie Smith

Read carefully and critically, spreading your work across the summer break. If you have previously read any of the material, you should reread it. Be aware that TV and film adaptations can supplement your reading, but should never substitute for it.

You are welcome to get the books wherever you like, and any editions will do. Paper or electronic versions are fine for summer reading.

**WRITING ASSIGNMENTS:**

**1. Responses:** From **each** book, copy three quotations that you find particularly meaningful. Type a well-developed one-paragraph response to each quotation (so six total). Explain how the quotation develops an essential insight into the personality of a character or how it develops one of the book's major themes. Paragraphs must be clear, organized, concise, and grammatically correct.

**2. Creative Writing:** For **each** book, write a typed page from the perspective of one character from the book (so two total). Be creative, but also prove to me that you know the character in question and understand his or her motivation, values, and style of speaking.

**3. Essay:** After we spend a few days discussing the summer reading, you will be expected to write an analytical essay; the topic will be discussed in class beforehand.
