I will be checking my school email until 6pm M-F. Messages coming in on Friday after 3:30pm will be answered on Monday.

The choral music program at Bishop Seabury Academy is integral to the school's liberal arts mission. Music Arts is considered a co-curricular subject and not an extra-curricular class. It gives the students an opportunity to develop particular skills that enhance their academic abilities. They actually complement the other curricular activities and help students grow in the "Art of living and working together."

Voci Sesto - Tuesdays and Thursdays 6th Hour

The 6th grade ensemble is designed to be experiential and provide a solid foundation of music theory, history and performance. Music of all different styles will be taught. This ensemble prepares the singers to move up to the Middle School ensembles. This course will strengthen the STEAM skills needed at Seabury: development of perceptual skills, language and literary abilities; spatial reasoning (related to skills used to do math); and fine motor coordination.

Shea Maris - Tuesdays and Thursdays 8th Hour

This 7/8th grade ensemble of girls is a two semester required course. The curriculum is designed to further develop the singing voice, ear training, sight singing skills and competency in reading three and four part voicing. Phonetics of various languages and a variety of musical styles are presented. Class work includes singing exercises to build and strengthen the voice, improve diction, breath support and resonance. Music Theory and Music History are also included in daily instruction. Sight singing technique is practiced on a daily basis. Additional work includes singing in small ensembles, written tests, singing tests and required evening performances. This course will strengthen the STEAM skills needed at Seabury: development of perceptual skills, language and literary abilities; spatial reasoning (related to skills used to do math); and fine motor coordination.

Mare Falco – Monday and Wednesday 8th Hour

This 7/8th grade ensemble of all boys is a two semester required course. The curriculum is designed to help young singers understand and develop the changing male voice, ear-training, sight singing skills and competency in reading three and four part voicing. Phonetics of various languages and a variety of musical styles are presented. Class work includes singing exercise to build, strengthen and carefully guide the voice through its development, improve diction, breath support and resonance. Music Theory and Music History are also included in daily instruction. Sight singing technique will be included on a daily basis. Additional work includes singing in small ensembles, written tests, singing tests and required evening performances. This course will strengthen the STEAM skills needed at Seabury: development of perceptual skills, language and literary abilities; spatial reasoning (related to skills used to do math); and fine motor coordination.

Academy Ensemble - Friday 8th Hour

This 7/8th grade ensemble of boys and girls is a two semester required course. The curriculum is designed to help young singers understand and develop ear-training, sight singing skills and competency in reading three and four part voicing. Listening skills are honed as this ensemble regularly sings four part voicing. Phonetics of various languages and a variety of musical styles are presented. Class work includes singing exercise to build, strengthen and carefully guide the voice through its development, improve diction, breath support and resonance. Music Theory and Music History are also included in daily instruction. Sight singing technique will be included on a daily basis. Additional work includes singing in small ensembles, written tests, singing tests and required evening performances. This course will strengthen the STEAM skills needed at Seabury: development of perceptual skills, language and literary abilities; spatial reasoning (related to skills used to do math); and fine motor coordination.

Chamber Choir/Chamber Singers/Prima Volta/Men's Ensemble - M-F 7th Hour

A great deal happens in one 42 minute rehearsal period. Chamber Choir is the award winning primary ensemble of grades 9-12 out of which comes the auditioned 26 voice ensemble, Chamber Singers; Prima Volta (women's ensemble) and the Men's Ensemble. It is a two-semester elective course. This course provides opportunities for the further development of a mature singing voice and sight singing independence. Students perform a variety of choral compositions of contrasting periods and styles. Students continue to expand their musical knowledge through the study of harmony, melodic and harmonic dictation, and music history. Guest performers and clinicians are occasionally utilized in the rehearsal setting. Expectations include a sincere desire to improve understanding and technique. Some out of school rehearsal and activities occur throughout the year. Students are required to attend all performances/competitions.

Curriculum

ABSENCES

If the student is absent, it is the student's responsibility to check what assignments were given for the days that were missed and get any notes/handouts required to complete the assignments.

Please see me before school the day after you were absent to gather any information. Out of respect for the students who were present in class I will not be able to bring you up to speed once class has started.

For ALL absences there will be a deduction of 2 points from the Rehearsal Skills Assessment. Students can earn <u>back</u> these points by seeing me the morning after their absence. See my office hours above to make sure you can find me.

Concert Dress Requirements - Ladies

Our ensembles present a uniform appearance that keeps our performance level high and allows our audience to fully engage in our performances.

- 1. Solid Black semi-formal shirt, blouse or dress (NO MINI SKIRTS, spaghetti strap or sleeveless tops).
- 2. Solid Black slacks or black skirts (NO MINI SKIRTS).
- 3. Solid Black Dress shoes open toed or closed (no flip flops or athletic shoes). Be careful of heels that may prevent your moving up and down risers in a safe manner.
- 4. Solid Black socks (with pants) or solid black nylons (no bare legs).
- 5. Jewelry should be simple and sparse.
